DETACH HERE AND KEEP WITH YOU AT ALL TIMES

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS QUICK-SHEET

YOU CAN TELL IMMIGRATION AGENTS OR THE POLICE THAT YOU ARE EXERCISING YOUR CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS, WHATEVER YOUR IMMIGRATION STATUS MAY BE:

- You can exercise your constitutional right under the 5th Amendment of the United States Constitution to remain silent
- You should have a lawyer before answering any question
- You can refuse to let them into your home unless they have a warrant signed by a judge
- You do not have to sign anything that you do not understand.
- You have the right to call your country's Consulate
