#### **PARISH NEWS**

Dear parishioners and friends,

In October 1958, Cardinal Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was elected pope at the age of 77. Ascending to the papacy at such an old age, he was expected to be a mere caretaker. But less than three months into office, in January of 1959, he surprised many by calling for the convening of an ecumenical council. Over two years of formal preparations went into launching the meetings on October 11, 1962.

Many have summarized the core purpose of the council as adapting Roman Catholicism to the modern world. Pope John died midway through the council on June 3, 1963.

Wednesday, October 11th, marks the 55th Anniversary of the Opening of the Council..... and it is the Feast of St. Pope JohnXXIII, not just the convoker of the Council but the author of two outstanding Encyclicals: "Mater et Magistra" and "Pacem in Terris"......I would urge you to read them....... If possible celebrate the Eucharist on Wednesday...and pray for the Church through the intercession of St. John XXIII.

The horror of the actions of a deranged man in Las Vegas last week once again makes us aware of the fact of the need for legislation to control the availability of guns. Did you realize that the last major gun control legislation was past in 1968, 49 years ago, when President Johnson submitted a bill and fought for its passage. That final piece of legislation did not go as far as he proposed, and nothing of any real consequence has been done since on the national level and so I was moved and challenged by the words of Mark Kelly, the retired astronaut and husband of former Congresswoman Gabby Gifford, when he stated that messages of thoughts and prayers to the families of victims in the Las Vegas shooting, while important, are "not enough.

"What we are hearing today at the Capitol and the White House are thoughts and prayers," Kelly told reporters outside of the Capitol building with his wife at his side. "Your thoughts and prayers aren't going to stop the next shooting. Only action and leadership will do that."

Did you realize that the House of Representatives was scheduled to discuss a bill that would relax restrictions on obtaining gun silencers?

"Imagine how much worse the [Las Vegas] shooting could have been if the gunman had a silencer," Kelly said. "Imagine the gun lobby's version of society — everyone armed, everyone out for themselves, everyone at risk all the time."

Let us pray and act for change.

Unfortunately, Las Vegas moved Puerto Rico out of the spotlight somewhat this past week. Immediately after my ordination I was assigned by Cardinal Cooke to study Spanish at The Catholic University of Puerto Rico in Ponce. Sunday after Sunday, saying Mass all over the Island, I came to know that Puerto Rico is a marvelous place. The picture

on the front page of the NY Times last Sunday of the destroyed bridge into Utado made me so aware of how ill informed we are of the Heberos, the country people, so cut off. Puerto Ricco is not just San Juan and the other costal cities...if only our president had traveled through the mountains, to Vega Alto and Vega Baja, to Utado and the so many other beautiful parts of that part of our land....pray for the people of Puerto Rico, citizens like you and I of the United States of America.

Finally, I would like to share with you some relevant information regarding ParishPay. We have 375 parishioners supporting the parish through this online giving platform, and this is a tremendous help to us as we struggle to make ends meet. Recently, ParishPay was bought over by Liturgical Publication, our Bulletin Company, and will thus be hosting our online donations but under a new platform called WeShare. The transfer is scheduled to take place from October 9-12, and during that time neither the ParishPay nor the WeShare website will be accessible. It is important to note that anyone already giving through ParishPay does not have to make changes to their account. The transfer should be seamless. The next time you log into ParishPay you will redirected to WeShare, or you can look out for the new WeShare address on the parish website after October 12<sup>th</sup>. Thank you for your continued generosity.

## **NOTICIAS PARROQUIALES**

Queridos Feligreses y Amigos,

En octubre de 1958, el cardenal Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli fue elegido Sumo Pontifice a la edad de 77 años. Al ser elegido tan mayor, se esperaba que fuera un Pontifice provisional. Pero con menos de tres meses en el cargo, en enero de 1959 sorprendió a muchos al convocar un consejo ecuménico. Despues de más de dos años de preparativos formales las reuniones comenzaron el 11 de octubre de 1962.

Muchos han resumido el propósito central del Concilio como adaptación del catolicismo romano al mundo moderno. El papa Juan murió durante el consejo el 3 de junio de 1963.

El miércoles 11 de octubre se conmemora el 55 aniversario de la inauguración del Concilio ... y es la fiesta de San Juan XIII, no sólo el convocador del Concilio, sino autor de dos importantes encíclicas: "Mater et Magistra "Y" Pacem in Terris "...... les insto a leerlos .......

Si les es posible asistan a la Eucaristía el miércoles ... y oren por la Iglesia y por la intercesión de San Juan XXIII.

El horror de las acciones de un loco en Las Vegas la semana pasada nos hace una vez mas conscientes de la necesidad de legislación para el control de las armas. ¿Se han dado cuenta de que la última legislación sobre el control de armas fue pasada hace 49 años en 1968, cuando el Presidente Johnson presentó un proyecto de ley y luchó por su aprobación? Esa última legislación no fue tan extensa como él propuso, y nada de consecuencia real se ha hecho a nivel nacional; me conmovieron las palabras de Mark Kelly, astronauta retirado y esposo de la ex Congresista Gabby Gifford, cuando declaró que los mensajes y oraciones a las familias de las víctimas en el tiroteo de Las Vegas, aunque importantes, "no son suficientes.

"Lo que estamos escuchando hoy en el Capitolio y en la Casa Blanca es ofrecer pensamientos y oraciones", dijo Kelly a periodistas fuera del edificio del Capitolio con su esposa a su lado. "Pensamientos y oraciones no van a evitar el próximo tiroteo, solo la acción y el liderazgo lo harán".

¿Se dieron cuenta de que la Cámara de Representantes estaba programada a discutir un proyecto de ley que relajaría las restricciones para la obtención de silenciadores de armas?

"Imagínense cuánto peor hubiera sido el tiroteo en Las Vegas si este hombre armado hubiera tenido un silenciador"?, dijo Kelly. "Imaginense la versión del "lobby" de armas... todo el mundo armado, todo el mundo por sí mismo, todo el mundo en riesgo todo el tiempo".

Oremos y actuemos por el cambio.

Lamentablemente, Las Vegas desplazó a Puerto Rico de los frentes editoriales la semana pasada. Inmediatamente después de mi ordenación, el cardenal Cooke me envió a estudiar español en la Universidad Católica de Puerto Rico en Ponce. Cada domingo, diciendo Misa por toda la Isla, pude ver que Puerto Rico es un lugar maravilloso. La foto en la portada del NY Times del pasado domingo del puente destruido en Utado me hizo pensar de lo mal informados que estamos sobre los Heberos, la gente del campo, tan aislada. Puerto Ricco no es sólo San Juan y las otras ciudades costeras ... si tan solo nuestro presidente hubiera viajado por las montañas, Vega Alto y Vega Baja, Utado y las tantas otras bellas partes de esa tierra ..... oremos por el pueblo de Puerto Rico, ciudadanos como tu y como yo de los Estados Unidos de America.

Finalmente quisiera compartir con ustedes algo relevante sobre ParishPay. Tenemos 375 feligreses apoyando a la parroquia a través de esta plataforma de donación en línea ("on line"), y esta es una tremenda ayuda para nosotros mientras luchamos para llegar a fin de mes. Recientemente, ParishPay fue comprado por Liturgical Publications, la compañía que imprime nuestros boletines; continuarán recibiendo nuestras donaciones en línea, pero bajo una nueva plataforma llamada WeShare. El cambio está programado del 9 al 12 de octubre, y durante ese tiempo el sitio web no estará accesible. Es importante tener en cuenta que cualquier persona que ya está donando a través de ParishPay no tiene que hacer cambios en su cuenta. During this Season of Creation which concluded on Oct. 4<sup>th</sup> with the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the focus was on fossil fuels. We need only look at the catastrophic events of the last month with wild fires, hurricanes and flooding to see the urgency of addressing the issue of fossil fuels. There is now a scientific consensus that our fossil fuel use is driving a rise in global temperatures and with it, the destructive consequences of that warming. Since carbon and methane emissions stay in the atmosphere for decades, things are bound to get worse.

We can take prophetic actions to change the course of events. We can reduce our carbon footprint in our personal lives by:

- 1) Modifying our personal daily habits to use less fuel/electricity
- 2) Making The SWITCH to household **renewable energy** or suggesting that our co-op do that either through Con Ed itself or through a reliable Energy Service Company (an ESCO) that works with ConEd, such as Green Mountain Energy or CleanChoice Energy and
- 3) Checking our personal investments to disinvest from fossil fuel-related industries (natural gas, oil, fracking equipment, pipeline companies etc.) and invest in renewables, which many financial advisors now consider less risky than investing in fossil fuels.

Regarding advocacy, we can push our elected officials to set higher targets for getting off fossil fuels as a city or state. We can push against infrastructure that brings fracked gas from neighboring states into New York, and against the construction of pipelines that bring dirty tarsands oil from Canada. We can advocate for the construction of wind and solar farms and greater tax breaks for those who install solar panels. And we can push our own institutions and the government entities to disinvest in fossil fuels and invest in renewable energy, which is growing at a fast pace.

Our future and that of our children and their children depend on our actions now.

As theologian Erin Lothes put it in her presentation here on the West Side two weeks ago, our sacrifice in making some of these changes is united with Christ's sacrifice in the crucifixion. It is a sacrifice for the greater good of humankind, in keeping with what we are called to do by Catholic Social Teaching.
